The Governor, Chris Christie, has ordered that two special elections take place to fill the vacancy left in the State Senate by the passing of Senator Frank Lautenberg.

The Special U.S. Senate Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, August 13, 2013. The polls, located at the Municipal Bldg., 39 Academy St., Califon, N.J., will open at 6:00 a.m. and will close at 8:00 p.m. The last day to register to vote in this special election is Tuesday, July 23rd. You can register to vote at the Califon Municipal Bldg. or at the Hunterdon County Board of Elections in Flemington. The Board of Elections will be open until 9:00 p.m. on the evening of July 23rd for anyone who wishes to register to vote there.

The Special U.S. Senate General Election will be held on Wednesday, October 16th. The polls will be open at 6:00 a.m. and will close at 8:00 p.m. More on this special election in the September-October edition of the Califon Crier.

RAILROAD AVENUE/MAIN STREET STORM WATER IMPROVEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

Over the past few weeks you may have noticed surveyors and other workers roaming the tract of land surrounded by Main Street, Railroad Avenue and Academy Street. It's all part of the work necessary for developing the engineering specifications for the Storm Water Improvement project.

The current phase of the project focuses on meeting the requirements set forth by the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) and SHPO (State Historical Preservation Office). The tasks under way to meet these requirements include:

- An Environmental Assessment that demonstrates the proposed limits of ground disturbance within the area, as well as investigating the potential impact to endangered species, such as the Indiana Bat and Small Whorled Pegonia.
- A Cultural Resources Survey which documents the current stone masonry channel and culvert system, as well as archaeological fieldwork including shovel test pits in the areas of anticipated ground disturbances.
- A Drainage System Improvement Field Survey which establishes a baseline and proposed relief piping plan.

The next phase will focus on the engineering aspects of the new storm water system, with the goal of reducing the amount of storm water into the storm water system and, during intense storms, spilling onto Main Street and Railroad Avenue.

POLICE REPORT: ZERO TOLERANCE FOR SPEEDING AND VANDALISM TO CONTINUE

The results from the Zero Tolerance for Speeding effort that was held last month clearly showed that, because of these efforts, speeding has been reduced significantly in town. Because of the success of this program, the Washington Township Police will be continuing their efforts throughout the summer months. "We're hoping to reduce the numbers even more," said Chief Bailey.

In addition, the Zero Tolerance policy for any type of unacceptable activity or vandalism in the Califon Island Park will continue.

A FIRE SAFETY MESSAGE FROM YOUR FIRE MARSHALL

The summer months are here and school recess is just days away. In the next two months we have lots of days and evenings filled with recreational joy and happiness to spend with our family and friends. FIREWORKS DISPLAYS are in the spirit of the coming July 4th holiday. When done by the professionals we minimize the chance of an accident that can result in serious injury or death to an adult or child. Every year the New Jersey State Division of Fire Safety receives statistics of those injured or resulting in death of those individuals who attempt to set off fireworks at gatherings for the enjoyment of others. Maybe you set them off last year everything went all right. This year can you be sure? Maybe just maybe this year when you light off the fuse it burns quicker or is shorter to the charge. Maybe you move away slower or get distracted. The end result may not be pretty to see. Letting amateurs handle and detonate fireworks is dangerous and deadly to everyone involved including those there just to watch.

We have another serious fire safety hazard concern this summer. It's the marketing of SKY LANTERNS throughout the Country. Recently I saw one in the night's sky over our camping site at Dover, Delaware's NASCAR race. We watched it until it went out of our sight. Where it ended up is anyone's guess! Hopefully it did not create a serious fire on the ground. These airborne paper lanterns are constructed of oiled rice paper on a bamboo frame with either a small candle or fuel cell of waxy flammable materials. When it's lit the lantern can travel significant distances from point of release. The flame heats the air inside the lantern causing it to rise into the air, when the unburned fuel source comes in contact with flammable or combustible materials it can result in unintentional fires on or off the property of the initial release. These lanterns or similar airborne devices that use open flame to propel them are prohibited.

So I will leave you with this. Leave the FIREWORKS to the professionals. There are numerous shows around the area including two nights at the Califon Firemen's Carnival. The SKY LANTERNS create a fire and safety hazard to life and property when released into the air.
