The 15th Volunteer Infantry will close the memorial service by performing a 21 gun salute as we pause for a moment of silent contemplation.

Afterward, Califon Fire Company will have food and drinks for purchase. Also joining the festivities are the Kona Ice Truck, Fun Fitness on Wheels by Kidz on the Go, and more!

Invitation is still open for community groups and organizations to participate; participants with antique cars and tractors, floats, animals (and their owners!), musical ensembles, etc. All are welcome and encouraged to participate in this annual event. TUESDAY, JUNE 2, 2015 - PRIMARY ELECTION FROM 6:00 A.M. TO 8:00P.M. AT THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING

Tuesday, May 12th is the last day to register to vote in the June Primary Election. Forms can be obtained at the Municipal Building, on line (www.co.hunterdon.nj.us/depts/elect); or at the Board of Elections at 71 Main St, Flemington; (908) 788-1190. The Board of Elections will be open until 9:00 pm on the 12th. Tuesday May 26th is the last day to apply *by mail* for a Mail in Ballot for the June Primary Election.

Thursday, May 28th the County Clerk's office will be open until 7pm to vote in person by Mail-In Ballot for the Primary Election; (908)788-1212; www.co.hunterdon.nj.us/countyclerk.htm Monday June 1st- 3pm deadline to apply at the County Clerk's Office in-person for a Mail-In Ballot for the Primary Election.

POLL WORKERS NEEDED – H.C. BOARD OF ELECTIONS

The Hunterdon County Board of Elections has reported that they are experiencing a shortage of poll workers throughout the County to run the Primary election in June and the General Election in November. Poll workers are required to work a full day at both elections; the hours are 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Each poll worker who works the full day earns \$200.00 for each election. Poll workers are required to participate in a certification training and, after the initial training, are required to recertify every two years. Interested????? **A FIRE SAFETY MESSAGE
FROM THE FIRE MARSHAL**

This past week I've been reading about all the fires around New Jersey in the recent edition of the First Responder Newspaper. These were terrible, terrible fires that destroyed many people's lives and there was one civilian fatality. There were a few occupant and firefighter injuries reported; thankfully, none were of a life threatening nature. As I continued reading, I was taken aback by the reports of the numerous problems firefighters faced when they entered these buildings. In many cases, people were still inside the buildings with the fires raging. Their homes/apartments were filled with their belongings; making it very difficult and dangerous for the firefighters to proceed with their rescue efforts. The number one priority of a firefighter is life safety and most will risk their lives to save victims. Entering the unknown, where you can't see in front of you because of the dense smoke conditions, makes it very dangerous for the firefighters. The accumulation of numerous belongings and items to get around and through makes it that much tougher for firefighters. Seconds count when they need to get to a trapped victim or to the source of the fire. A firefighter needs every precious second to find the seat of the fire to either contain it or extinguish it.

That is why, with the warmer weather upon us, it is a good time to do a thorough clean-up and clean-out of your house or your apartment. We should take the time to organize and get rid of a lot of things we've collected that we might not need any more. Remember a small fire will become a big fire when combustibles are available to spread the fire. Good house-keeping should be on everyone list of projects in the summer months!

Just drop the check off at the Municipal Offices or mail them to the attention of Karen Mastro. Licenses are \$11.00 for spayed/neutered \$14.00 for non-spayed/neutered. If this is your first time licensing, then you can fill out an application available on our website; www.califonboro.net. At the very bottom, click on documents and there will be an application for dog license; or you can stop by the Municipal Offices and pick one up. If your dog's rabies vaccination expired since your last licensing, I will need a copy of the new rabies certificate showing the expiration date.
