The Dog Days aren't just when your dog starts panting on a sweltering summer day. These days once coincided with the year's heliacal (at sunrise) rising of the Dog Star, Sirius. Ancient folks thought that the "combined heat" of Sirius and the Sun caused summer's swelter. The rising of Sirius does not actually affect the weather, but for the ancient Egyptians, Sirius appeared just before the Nile River's flood season. They used Sirius as a "watchdog" for that event. Because it also coincided with a time of extreme heat, the connection with hot, sultry weather was made for all time. The Dog Days of summer are traditionally the 40 days beginning July 3 and ending August 11, which coincide with the morning rise of the Dog Star, Sirius. This is soon after the summer Solstice, which of course also indicates that heat will soon set in.

Although in Califon we don't really experience summer's swelter till late August, we can mark our summers beginning with the annual Califon Firemen's Carnival. The sounds of the rides, music, the call of the hourly 50/50 and of course the fireworks let us know that summer is here. Califor has a plethora of summer activities to offer that are sure to keep our residents occupied as the temperature rises. The river that runs through our town and extends into the Ken Lockwood Gorge is perhaps some of the best fishing to be had in the state of New Jersey. The Columbia trail that passes right through our town is a great place to walk, run or ride your bicycle and enjoy the beautiful landscapes that our county has to offer. Califon Summer Fun Days sponsored by the Califon Recreation Committee are just around the corner. The Califon Recreation Committee will be hosting a week of fun activities for children at Califon Island Park. CALIFON FIRE COMPANY TO HOLD 98TH ANNUAL CARNIVAL

The Califon Fire Company will be holding its 98th Annual Firemen's Carnival from Monday, July 2 thru Saturday, July 7th at the Firemen's Field behind the Borough Hall at 39 Academy Street in Califon. The Carnival has been held continuously since the Fire Company's founding in 1921 and is the major annual fund raiser for the Fire Company.

Monday July 2, Wednesday July 4 and Thursday, July 5 will be bracelet nights featuring ride all night for one price. Discounted advance bracelet tickets are available from Califon Wine & Spirits, Califon Lumber and at Campys.com. Fireworks displays are scheduled for Tuesday July 3 and Friday July 6.

Amusement rides and games of chance will once again be provided by Campy's Amusements. Three food stands manned by the Fire Company will feature hot dogs, hamburgers, sausage sandwiches, roast beef sandwiches, clams, funnel cakes, french fries, perogies and homemade clam chowder.

Also available at the carnival will be tickets for two raffles. Prizes for one raffle are a Weber grill donated by Califon Lumber and a bicycle. The other raffle is the Fire Company's "Super Raffle" in which only 400 tickets are offered at \$100 each. 50% of the proceeds are paid out to winners and assuming all tickets are sold, the grand prize is \$10,000. The "Super Raffle" has sold out each year and we expect this year to sell out as well. The "Super Raffle" drawing will be Thursday, July 19th.

Parking is available at and near the carnival grounds. On fireworks nights, parking will also be available at the field behind the Rite Aid Store at the corner of Main Street and Route 513. Parking is free at the field although donations are accepted and a shuttle bus will be provided to and from the carnival grounds.

The Califon Fire Company, founded in 1921, is an independent non-profit organization providing fire and emergency services in Califon Borough and Tewksbury Township. The Fire Company owns and maintains it's own fire trucks, equipment and buildings. While annual donations are provided by Califon Borough and Tewksbury Township, 70% of Fire Company's income is obtained thru fund-raising activities such as the annual carnival.


Come see what's new since our book and gift buying trips this summer. We hope to have something for all your gift buying needs!

JONATHON SLUSHER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Jonathan Slusher Memorial Scholarship Foundation has awarded six \$1,000.00 for 2018. The scholarships are awarded to area high school seniors intending to major in journalism/communications.

Originally, the Foundation planned to award four \$1,000 scholarships but changed the number to six when reviewing the many applications with their outstanding essays.

The following students will each receive a \$1,000 award: From Hunterdon Central High School, Lauren Blaser; from North Hunterdon High School, David Lazar; from Voorhees High School Brielle Barozzini; from Mendham High School, Daphne Nydam; from West Morris Central High School, Augusta Modla; and from Mt. Olive High School, Robert Dziejma.

The Jonathan Slusher Memorial Scholarship Foundation was established by Slusher's family following Jonathan's passing from brain cancer in 2010. At the time of death, Jon Slusher was editor of the Hunterdon Review. He was admired not only for his editorial expertise but also for his involvement in the communities he served. He was also passionate about racing since his High School days at Voorhees where he was co-captain of the championship 1982 Cross Country Team and continued racing until September, 2009, one month before he was diagnosed with brain cancer.

The Foundation is funded from donations and from the annual Jon Slusher Memorial 5K Run/Walk event held in Califon annually and partners with the Califon Street Festival.
